Prerequisites

At least 120 credits from the Journalism and Media Production Programme (MGJOM), or the equivalent.

Objectives

After having completed the course, the student should be able to

- use their programme-related skills and knowledge at a workplace that ties in with the subject
- present a selection of professional roles relating to the subject, found at the placement workplace
- present a selection of production methods, design tools, and production and developmental processes relating to the subject, found at the placement workplace
- present different types of professional ethical questions and questions to do with sustainable development that the student faces at the placement workplace
- evaluate their own performance and the result of their own design-technical work at the placement workplace.

Content

The course is primarily conducted in the form of a practice placement at a workplace of relevance to the Journalism and Media Production Programme. During the course, the student also writes an academic report. There is also a seminar summarising the practice placement.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of a practice placement, a seminar, and individual supervision.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the course objectives.

The course is examined through an academic report and a seminar presentation.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to adapt the exam or to let the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Resit examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University.

Course Evaluation

During or shortly after the course, a course evaluation should be conducted. The result and analysis of the course evaluation should be promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time should be informed of the result at the course introduction. The course evaluation is anonymous.

Other

The course is part of the third year of the Journalism and Media Production Programme. The student is expected to find a practice placement themselves. The programme coordinator must approve the chosen practice placement.
