Prerequisites

Master of Arts in Education or 60 credits within general education studies in teacher education or its equivalent

Objectives

After completing the course, students shall be able to:

- critically examine and analyse educational work settings from an educational, legal, ethical and equality perspective,
- analyse and apply theoretical knowledge in group psychology and leadership and
- discuss different models for communication and conflict management.

Content

The course contains the following elements:

- · leadership theory
- leadership in educational, ethical, legal and equality perspectives
- · group theories and group processes
- · communication and conflict management
- attitudes and norms/change
- · current leadership research

Type of Instruction

The course runs as a distance learning course and includes some obligatory meetings.

Teaching is in the form of lectures and seminars, individual and group work. Discussions

and information are carried out for the most part in the virtual learning environment. The extent of obligatory elements is specified in the study guide and schedule.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive a grade of Pass, the intended learning outcomes must be attained. Examination takes place in the form of written and oral examination assignments, and through active participation in seminars/web-based teaching. Detailed information about the examination assignments and grading criteria is given in the study guide.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis are presented to the students who have completed the course as well as to the students at the following course date. The course evaluation is conducted anonymously.
