Objectives

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- Demonstrate fundamental knowledge of theories and methods for evaluation in social work
- Account for the meaning of and reflect over evidence-based practice in social work
- Critically examine evaluation reports
- Apply fundamental knowledge in quantitative methods during construction of surveys and computer processing in SPSS
- Carry out an evaluation design for a operation or an intervention in social work

Content

- Relationship research/evaluation
- Models for evaluation
- Evaluation as an integrated part of social work practice
- Evidence-based practice in social work
- Examination of evaluations carried out in social services
- Formation of a survey as well as processing of data in SPSS

Type of Instruction

Teaching stems from a problem-oriented approach and consists of lectures, seminars, group discussions, practical exercises and field studies. Obligatory attendance is expected during parts of the course and this is specified in the schedule or study guidelines.
