# Objectives

After completing the course, the students should be able to do the following in German:

- present advanced knowledge of the literature, culture, and social conditions of the German-speaking countries, with a focus on literature, and use this in analysis
- · use correct and varied German in both spoken and written form
- discuss issues in literary studies.

#### Content

The course includes a number of literary works from the German-speaking world, ranging from the Enlightenment to modern times. The course builds on the overview of German literary history presented in the previous semester. The course also includes an introduction to literary terminology and methodology.

Text studies I: Modern classics.

Text studies II: Classics from the 18th and 19th centuries.

# Type of Instruction

Instruction is delivered in the form of seminars. Attendance is mandatory.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the course objectives.

The course is examined through oral presentations and an oral examination.

### Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted and compiled into a report, which is made available to students and filed according to departmental regulations.
