Prerequisites

At least 60 credits on entry level including 22.5 credits Caring Science.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- Problematize and analyse the health concept and its significance
- Problematize the importance of the room for the patient's recovery
- Identify the need for and carry out health-promotional and preventative care
- Plan, carry out and evaluate health-support conversations
- Analyse the relationships in society that influence children's, women's and men's health

Content

- different perspectives on health
- human vulnerability
- meaning and context
- life-rhythm and life-force
- caring room
- health-support conversations
- illness prevention and health-promotion

Obligatory elements are specified in the course schedule.

Type of Instruction

- application exercises
- supervision
- individual work
- group work
- lectures
- seminars

Teaching will partly be carried out via the learning platform. The course contains training elements for the development of skills, abilities and attitudes. Part of the teaching will be carried out via campus-based teaching, health centre or other such operations.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is examined through practical and written examinations as well as seminars. For a grade of Pass, all expected learning outcomes must be fulfilled. For a grade of Pass with credit, students must receive a grade of Pass with credit on the written examination and on the written assignment. Assessment of students' performances is carried out in the form of individual written examinations and written assignments. A resit examination is offered in accordance with local rules for examination on entry level and advanced level at Linnaeus University (dnr: HL/2010-3069). Students at Linnaeus University can receive their grades in accordance with the seven-grade ECTS-scale. Such requests should be made at the start of the course.

Course Evaluation

A written evaluation is carried out and compiled in a report, which is archived at the institution. The results, along with possible measures taken, are reported to the students the next time the course is given.
