### **Prerequisites**

General entry requirements for second-cycle studies, plus specific entry requirements:

- Introduction to eHealth, A1N, 10 credits, of the equivalent.
- English B/English 6, or the equivalent.

## Objectives

After completing this course the student should be able to:

- account for the role of financial control in public organisations
- explain, apply and critically discuss financial concepts, models and methods for financial control for the planning and evaluation of various decisions
- apply and critically discuss different calculation models with regard to the calculation situation in question
- account for the development of the role of process orientation and performance measurement in healthcare and social care
- apply and critically discuss process orientation and performance measurement

## Content

The course contains:

- basic financial concepts
- calculation
- process orientation
- performance measurement

## Type of Instruction

Teaching is carried out as distance learning with help from a learning platform and consists of self-studies based on instructions from the course coordinator. The teaching consists of lecture and seminar. The course requires access to a computer and the internet. No compulsory meetings on campus are included.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The course is examined through two field reports and an individual written exam. The field report 1 and 2 constitutes 60% of the course and individual written exam constitutes 40% of the course.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail. Grading criteria for the A–F scale are communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course at the latest, as well as how the weighting and weighting of grades on individual examining elements to the final course grade takes place. The basis for the student's grade is determined by the student's fulfillment of the objectives.

Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University. An examiner can, in exceptional cases, decide that a student who is close to the level for a passing grade may carry out supplementary assignments in order to reach the passing grade.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

## Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close conjunction with the course, a course evaluation is to be carried out. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are to be promptly presented as feedback to the students who have completed the course. Students who participate during the next course instance receive feedback at the start of the course. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.
