## Content

The course consists of the writing of a master thesis. The means to apply and integrate the theoretical knowledge acquired in the course Management Control Systems and Process Based Organizations in accordance with the local guidelines for Master Theses

## Type of Instruction

The teaching methods consists of seminars and thesis. The teaching methods are

internet-based.

### **Examination**

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The modes of examination of the achieved learning outcomes are written reports and oral presentations.

Results are graded using one of the terms Passed with distinction (80% -100%), Pass (60%-79%) or Fail (0%-59%), and A-F according to the ECTS scale.

### **Course Evaluation**

A written evaluation is conducted and compiled in a report, which is filed at the department. The result and actions, if taken, are communicated to the teacher responsible for the course and presented to the students in the way most appropriate according to the teacher responsible for the course.
