French 1-90 credits including a degree project.

Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- describe French language structure from various perspectives,
- critically discuss linguistic theories and methods,
- · analyse and discuss academic articles,
- independently conduct a minor study,
- express themselves in speech and writing using correct academic French.

Content

This course discusses various ways of describing the French language from grammatical, semantic and sociolinguistic perspectives. The students study and test various models for analysis, read research articles and conduct their own minor studies.

All sessions marked as seminars in the schedule are compulsory.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered through an online learning platform. Teaching is delivered in the form of oral and/or written online lectures and online discussions between the teacher and individual students and between the students.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction

(VG)

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the intended learning outcomes.

Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction (VG) can be found in the study guidelines.

Examination forms that occur include written and oral examinations, continuous assessment, oral presentations and written assignments.

Students who do not submit their assignments by the deadlines given receive the grade of Fail.

For students who do not pass the first examination, no more than four retake examinations are provided.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted and compiled into a report, which is made available to students and filed according to departmental regulations.
