#### **Prerequisites**

French 1–90 credits including a degree project in the subject of French literary studies of at least 15 credits.

## Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- describe tendencies in feminist gender theories and put them in a socio-cultural and knowledge theoretical context
- present and explain central concepts and issues in feminist gender theories
- apply these concepts in concrete textual analyses of contemporary Francophone novels.

#### Content

The course provides an introduction to central issues and tendencies in feminist gender theories and how these are reflected in current works of fiction from different parts of the Francophone world. Current Francophone novels are discussed and analysed based on different feminist perspectives in modernism, postmodernism, psychoanalysis, and postcolonial and decolonial theories.

### Type of Instruction

The teaching is distance-based and carried out via an online learning platform.

Teaching is delivered in the form of oral and written online lectures and individual discussions online between the teacher and individual students and between the students.

#### Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the intended learning outcomes. The grade A is the highest grade and the grade E is the lowest grade for passing the course. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as failed. Grading criteria for the grades A–F are specified in writing when the course starts.

The course is examined through written hand-in assignments, oral assignments, and contributions to discussion fora.

Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University.
