Objectives

After having completed the course students shall be able to:

- undertake a qualified investigation on a chosen topic within the contemporary international debate over development issues,
- apply different ways of measurement and analysis of poverty, inequality and development, and
- describe, analyse and evaluate different normative arguments in the contemporary debate on development co-operation, its effectiveness and future.

Content

The course is dealing with international development co-operation and the global challenges the world society may have to confront in the future. The students are expected to search and read both theoretical and policy documents around the chosen topic. The course is to large extent built upon an independent assignment, with relevant

supervision.

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of lectures and seminars

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Assessment is carried out through a seminar where the project work is presented
