Objectives

On completion of the course, students should

- have acquired specialised knowledge in social scientific perspective on the study of sport and health
- have acquired specialised knowledge in different perspectives on how organisations and leadership in the sporting field can be understood and studied.
- have acquired specialised knowledge in and understanding for ethical problems within sport.

Content

The course contains:

- social scientific perspectives on sport
- leadership processes
- organisation and organisational development
- theories, concepts and problem situations within ethics
- ethical decision-making

Type of Instruction

Lectures and seminars, individual and group work. All lessons are mandatory.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

Course Evaluation

Course evaluations are carried out verbally and/or in writing continuously throughout the course. At the end of the course, a written course evaluation is performed. Course evaluations are compiled and stored at the institution. The results are fed back to the students who have taken the course and are presented, together with the possible measures taken, to the students the next time the course is given.
