Prerequisites

90 credits in creative writing including an independent project of at least 15 credits, or the equivalent, and English 5 and Swedish 3.

Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- come up with and realise their own literary ideas; independently formulate and solve artistic problems and problems to do with characterisation; and conduct artistic projects
- present artistic research and development in the field of fiction or essay writing and critically discuss this in depth
- deal with complex questions and contexts in their own writing and in relation to artistic research projects.

Module 1: The contexts of the literary text, 10 credits

After completing the module, the student should be able to:

- critically analyse anddescribe their own and others' approach to artistic creation
- analyse and describe the artistic process and the aesthetic choices made in literary work

- demonstrate an ability to identify their own need of further knowledge to develop as a writer
- demonstrate an ability to discuss and form an opinion about knowledge in the literary research field
- demonstrate an ability to discuss literary writing in relation to society and other artistic contexts.

Module 2: Artistic work, degree project, 20 credits

After completing the module, the student should be able to:

- write a publishable text that is artistically elaborate, independent, and original in its characterisation, in the genre of epic poetry, lyric poetry, drama, or essayism
- independently approach knowledge in the artistic field of research and integrate this into their own artistic development work
- critically reflect on their own and others' literary and essayistic approach, and give well-founded comments on others' writing.

Content

Module 1, The contexts of the literary text (10 credits)

The students write an essay, either documenting their own artistic process and discussing the contexts and aesthetic characteristics of their current work, or analysing a broader and more general literary theme.

Module 2, Artistic work, degree project (20 credits)

In consultation with their supervisor, the student chooses to either continue with a previous project, or initiate a new one. Throughout the module, the student furthermore writes short texts commenting on their own project as well as on other students' texts, in a critical, reflecting and evaluating way. The project may serve as the degree project for a 60-credit master's degree in Fine Arts.

Type of Instruction

The course is a distance learning course, delivered in the form of lectures, text response, supervision, and discussions using a digital learning platform.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

The course is examined through continuous assignments and active participation in all parts of the course. In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives.

Resit examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University. If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

During or shortly after the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course.
