### Prerequisites

General entry requirements for second-cycle studies and 90 credits in a subject in the humanities or social sciences. English 6 or the equivalent.

### Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- demonstrate knowledge of and understanding of the labor market that the programme prepares for,
- apply their program-related knowledge and skills at a workplace relevant to the program's focus,
- demonstrate the ability to translate theoretical knowledge into practical communication work,
- present and critically analyse experiences and insights gained from the workplace,
- document and report ongoing work at the placement organization in relation to

- the programme's specialization,
- evaluate their own performance and the results of their work in relation to the programme's specialization.

## Content

The course is mainly conducted as supervised internship at a public institution, voluntary organisation, or private workplace involved in media, culture, societal issues, or digital applications. The student communicates with a supervisor about the programme's theoretical perspectives and their relevance to professional practice, as well as the workplace's cultural or societal role.

## Type of Instruction

The course consists of a placement at a workplace.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

To receive a Pass grade, the course objectives must be achieved.

Assessment is conducted through an academic report that includes a logbook from the internship period.

Resit examination is offered in accordance with Linnaeus University's Local regulations for courses and examination at the first- and second-cycle levels. In the event that a student with a disability is entitled to special study support, the examiner will decide on adapted or alternative examination arrangements.

## Course Evaluation

A course evaluation should be conducted during the course or in connection with its conclusion. The results and analysis of the completed course evaluation should be promptly communicated to students who have completed the course. Students participating in the next course instance should be informed of the results of the previous course evaluation and any improvements that have been made, no later than at the start of the course.

## Other Information

The opportunity for an internship is available during year 2, semester 3 of the programmes. The student is responsible for arranging their own internship placement. The programme coordinator must approve the choice of placement. Any additional costs related to travel, assignments, or similar expenses are to be covered by the student.
