Prerequisites

Musicology III (90 credits in progression) or the equivalent.

Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to

- compare historiography within different areas of music, focusing on art music and popular music,
- account for, and critically discuss, music historiography from different perspectives such as biographies, style history and the history of nations,
- critically review and discuss theories on, and ideational requisites for, historiography.

Content

- Literature study and discussions of examples of historiography in different genres and from different perspectives;
- Study of theories on historiography;
- Discussion of current examples of historiography in musicology, from a national as well as an international perspective.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is based on the students' active participation. It is delivered in the form of lectures and seminars. A major part of the course consists of individual study.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades rail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is examined through oral and written seminar assignments, as well as through a final written assignment. The examination as a whole and its credits are valid only when all component parts are completed.

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified in writing when the course starts. For students who do not pass their first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examinations at the first and second levels at Linnaeus University. If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner may offer an adapted exam or allow the student to conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

During or shortly after the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course. The evaluation is anonymous.
