Prerequisites

67.5 credits from SAPS2 or the equivalent.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, the student shall:

- show the ability to work independently with research
- show the ability to search for scientific literature with the aid of data bases
- show the ability to state a scientific and psychologically relevant research question
- focusing on industrial and organization psychology, and develop a research plan
- independently carry out the data collection
- perform advanced data analyses of collected data
- critically discuss obtained results and relate them to relevant research in the field
- write a report with the potential to publish in a scientific journal

Content

- the course contains individual tutoring and seminars

Type of Instruction

Individual tutoring of degree project.

Language of instruction: Swedish. English, if international students are admitted to the course.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

Grade criteria for the A–F scale are communicated to the student through a special document. The student is to be informed about the grade criteria for the course by the start of the course at the latest.

Course Evaluation

Upon completion of the course, a written course evaluation is carried out. The evaluation is compiled and fed back to the students, and archived according to departmental regulations.

Credit Overlap

This course cannot be part of a degree in combination with another course in which the content fully or partly correspond to the content of this course: 4PS012, 30 credits
