### **Prerequisites**

General entry requirements for second-cycle studies and specific entry requirements: 30 credits in Legal Science or equivalent and English, level 2, or equivalent.

### **Objectives**

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

*Knowledge and understanding*

- account for the main sources and principles of law within the field,
- account for the interaction between public law and private law, and between public financing and private activities,

*Competence and skills*

- apply the legal rules and principles taught in the course and independently draw well-founded conclusions based on the same,
- by the use of legal methods, systematically, critically and independently identify and assess complex legal issues related to public procurement,
- identify and conduct information retrieval relevant to the course,

### *Judgement and approach*

- account for how legal rules concerning public procurement interact with various economic, political and social factors in society,
- assess complex legal issues related to public procurement, taking into consideration related societal issues such as environmental and social considerations.

## Content

The course looks into the framework of EU law in the form of treaty provisions, directives and general principles that govern public procurement in the EU. The course also discusses the role of the regulatory framework of public procurement in the surrounding society.

## Type of Instruction

Instruction takes place in the form of lectures and workshops.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course objectives takes place by means of seminars (2.5 credits) and a written individual exam (5 credits).

In order to receive a grade of Pass, the course objectives must be attained. For a grade of Pass with Distinction in the course, it is required that the individual written examination is assessed as Pass with Distinction.

Resit examination is offered in accordance with Linnaeus University's Local regulations for courses and examination at the first- and second-cycle levels. In the event that a student with a disability is entitled to special study support, the examiner will decide on adapted or alternative examination arrangements.

## Course Evaluation

A course evaluation should be conducted during the course or in connection with its conclusion. The results and analysis of the completed course evaluation should be promptly communicated to students who have completed the course. Students participating in the next course instance should be informed of the results of the previous course evaluation and any improvements that have been made, no later than at the start of the course.
