Prerequisites

180 ECTS credits and English language skills corresponding to English B, IELTS or TOEFL.

Objectives

Knowledge and understanding

After completing the course the participant is expected to:

- Be able to define the main concepts from theories on multicultural issues.
- Be able to account for the main challenges and possibilities concerning multicultural work environments.
- Be able to account for the main strategies of managing multicultural work teams.

Competence and skills

After completing the course the participant shall have:

- Attained the ability to verbally and in writing critically discuss the cultural phenomena using different theoretical standpoints.
- Attained the ability to verbally and in writing take the departure in one's own cultural background and discuss other cultural contexts with sufficient ethics.

Content

The course includes the following elements:

- The main theoretical multicultural concepts and approaches.
- Leadership in multicultural environments.

• Challenges of living and working with a multicultural crew.

The course consists of self-studies on distance with a limited number of mandatory meetings. The first meeting is a start-up in Kalmar with information and lectures. The final meeting in Kalmar includes seminar, examination and course evaluation. Additional meetings may be added. Between meetings there will be activities on the e-learning platform MyMoodle.

Type of Instruction

Lecturers, seminars and activities on MyMoodle platform.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The course is assessed with the grades A-F. The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail (i.e. received the grade F).

The examination is based on written reports, oral presentations and active participation during seminars.
