Prerequisites

General entry requirements for studies at second-cycle level and 15 credits in second-cycle courses in Skill and Technology or equivalent courses.

Objectives

After completing the course the student should:

- be able to use artistic formation to develop his/her professional skill
- be able to conduct a critical dialogue about the potential of the art of acting to be used as a model for his/her own professional skill
- show a deepened understanding for similarities and differences between the art and sciences as sources of knowledge
- show understanding of how literature and narratives can be used in the development of professional practice

Content

- art as a source of knowledge
- deepened studies of the art of acting as a model for all professional exercise
- artistic formation as a condition to make knowledge aquired by previous experience accesible for reflection
- the third culture: art and sciences
- reading and writing as a tool for development of knowledge at work

Type of Instruction

The education is carried out through assemblies at campus on two occasions each semester, consisting of lectures and seminars. Each assembly last two days, another hit during a workday scheduled for examination. Further studies are carried out through reading of course literature and accounts, individually and in groups on the learning management system. Obligatory parts are stipulated in the beginning of the course.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is assessed with the grades failed, passed or passed with distinction. The student is assessed individually both through written and oral examinations, individually and in groups. Assessment of the students' proficiency is carried out continuously.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out in the termination of the course. The course evaluation is compiled, communicated to the students and filed in accordance to the departments regulations.
