Prerequisites

General entry requirements for studies at second cycle and specific entry requirements; at least 45 credits from the master program Tourism and Sustainability and English B/6 or equivalent.

Objectives

After completing this course the student is expected to be able to:

- plan, carry out and evaluate an individual project on current issues and debates in contemporary tourism research on the basis of an identified need of further knowledge

Content

The course gives the student the possibility for further specialization in Tourism studies. The course involves that the student plans, carries out and evaluates an individual project on current issues and debates in tourism research. In accordance with the degree objectives for the advanced level, students are given a great responsibility for the project, which also means that it must be designed according to their own identified educational needs.

Type of Instruction

The teaching consists of individual supervision.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The course objectives are examined through oral and written presentations of the individual project.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

After each regular examination there will be at least one new examination in close proximity to the date the results of the regular exam were posted. A minimum of five occasions for written exams will be offered in relation to the syllabus to which the student was accepted. Usually three occasions per academic year are offered. Students that fail reports can complement after instructions from the examiner to obtain a pass grade.

Grading criteria for the A–F scale are communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course at the latest, as well as how grades on separate elements of examination are weighed to a final course grade.

Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close connection to the course a course evaluation is to be carried out. Result and analysis of the course evaluation is to be presented as feedback both to the students who have completed the course and to the students who are to participate on the course the next time it is offered. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.
