Prerequisites

Objectives

After completion of the course, in relation to Anaesthesia Care the student is expected to be able to:

- Apply science evidence and proven experience in the nursing context in Anaesthesia Care.
- Demonstrate a pedagogical capacity in care through informing, instructing and supervising co-workers, students, patients and their relatives.
- Looking at the whole person, assess actions based on relevant scientific and social aspects, with particular regard to human rights.
- Be independently responsible for monitoring and administering local and general anaesthesia, analgesia and sedation in connection with surgery, examinations and treatments of patients.
- Based on the patient's needs, draw up a nursing plan and lead, coordinate and evaluate the procedures in the plan in a team
- Based on Caring Sciences theory, demonstrate the ability to reflect on a professional approach to patients and their relatives.
- Reflect on patients and the situation of their relatives in connection with end-

stage care in the case of sudden death with particular regard to ethical aspects.

 Identify his/her needs for further knowledge and to continuously develop his/her skills

Content

The course includes the following elements:

- · Clinical training in Anaesthesia Care, 15 credits.
- · Teaching and supervision in Anaesthesia Care
- Supervision of and team collaboration in a perioperative care context
- · Patient safety in an Anaesthesia Care context
- · Care ethics in Anaesthesia Care

Mandatory elements are specified in the course timetable.

Type of Instruction

- Individual project
- Work in groups
- Seminars

The course will be implemented in part via a learning platform. The course contains exercises to train the development of skills, capabilities and approach.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is assessed with the grades Failed, Pass or Pass with credit.

The course is examined in the form of a clinical examination and a written multi-stage examination of the content of the course. To achieve a Pass grade, the objectives of the course must be met. To achieve a Pass with credit grade requires a Pass with credit for the written examination. Retaking the examination is offered.

Completion of the clinical training is limited to two placement periods.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is conducted during the course or shortly after the course. The results and analysis of the course evaluation are to be provided to the students who completed the course and the students enrolled for the next time the course is run. The course evaluation is completed anonymously.
