Objectives

After completing the course the student will be expected to be able to:

- Independently monitor and perform a normal delivery and monitor and perform a complicated delivery while being supervised
- Independently identify and assess conditions and changes in the mother and the newly-born baby and start adequate treatment in emergencies
- Based on a holistic perspective make an assessment of measures to be taken and identify the needs of parents for greater support from the viewpoint of the midwife's ethical code with particular consideration for human rights
- Critically review and analyze care situations and routines based on research and evidence-based knowledge and when necessary initiate and contribute to change
- Evaluate treatment and make suggestions for improvement in complex care situations in accordance with current regulations and guidelines
- Systematically lead, prioritize, distribute and coordinate the care based on the needs of the woman and the family and reflect on one's own ability to cooperate
- Demonstrate insight into current research and development work in the field of reproductive, perinatal and sexual health and their importance for the midwife

- Identify, report and record deviations and incidents that occur on the ward in accordance with the current regulations

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The examination consists of an individual clinical examination and written assignment with seminar. An assessment from the clinical studies is also included in the grading. In order to gain the Pass grade the course objectives must have been achieved. In order to gain a Pass with Distinction grade the written assignment has to be assessed as a Pass with distinction.

The opportunity to retake the examination is offered in accordance with the Local Rules for Examinations on the first and second levels at Linnaeus University (Current version). Students at Linnaeus University are entitled to have the course grade translated into the seven-grade ECTS scale. A request to have the grades translated must be made at the start of the course.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation will be carried out during the course or soon after. The result and the analysis of the course evaluation will be communicated to the students who have completed the course and presented to those who take the course the next time it is given. The course evaluation is anonymous.

Other

The number of periods for carrying out clinical studies is limited to two. The clinical studies can be located outside Kalmar/Växjö, which can entail costs for travel to and/or accommodation at the location of the clinical studies.
