## **Objectives**

After completing the course the student will be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- Account for the meaning of and consequences of a palliative and personcentered approach based on the perspective of the older person and his/her family
- Discuss theoretical foundations in a caring encounter based on a palliative and person-centered approach
- Identify, analyze and assess relevant nursing actions concerning the elderly with a life-threatening illness based on a palliative and person-centered approach

## Skills and ability

 Critically review and analyze the importance of the ethical and professional approaches for the older person's experience of dignity and well-being with a consideration of human rights

Judgement and approach

- Reflect on and analyze an individual's situation based on his/her life history, culture and social context from the perspectives of power and gender when caring for older persons in end-of-life care
- Identify one's own needs for further developing a person-centered and palliative approach

- Participation in scheduled, web-based discussions in accordance with the study guide is compulsory

## Type of Instruction

The teaching is based on the principles of problem-based learning with active knowledge seeking, critical thinking and problem solving and an integrated learning. The teacher-led instruction consists of recorded lectures, group work and seminars. The course is based on half-time study and completely web-based.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The course is assessed with the grades: Fail, Pass or Pass with Distinction.

The examination consists of two individual written assignments and a written group examination. In order to gain the Pass grade the expected learning outcomes must have been achieved.

Overall assessment of grades for the whole course:

In order to achieve a Grade E for the whole course at least a Pass grade on parts 1 and 2 are required as well as at least Grade E on part 3

In order to achieve a Grade D for the whole course at least a Pass grade on parts 1 and 2 are required as well as at least Grade D on part 3

In order to achieve a Grade C for the whole course at least a Pass grade on parts 1 and 2 are required as well as at least Grade C on part 3

In order to achieve a Grade B for the whole course at least a Pass grade on parts 1 and 2 are required as well as at least Grade B on part 3

In order to achieve a Grade A for the whole course at least a Pass grade on parts 1 and 2 are required as well as at least Grade A on part 3
