Prerequisites

Basic entry requirements for studies at advanced level and special entry requirements:

- Ambulance Care 4VÅ612, 22.5 credits

Objectives

After completion of the course, in the context of Ambulance Care the student is expected to be able to:

- Apply science and proven experience in the nursing context in Ambulance Care.
- Demonstrate a pedagogical capacity in care through informing, instructing and supervising co-workers, students, patients and their relatives.
- Looking at the whole person, assess actions based on relevant scientific and social aspects, with particular regard to human rights.
- Integrate his/her knowledge by independently, under highly variable circumstances, perform prehospital assessments of the somatic and psychological status of the sick or injured.
- Based on the patient's needs, draw up a nursing plan and lead, coordinate, implement and evaluate the procedures in the plan in a team.
- Based on Caring Sciences theory, demonstrate the ability to reflect on a professional approach to patients and their relatives.
- Reflect on patients and the situation of their relatives in connection with end-stage care in the case of sudden death with particular regard to ethical aspects.
- Identify his/her needs for further knowledge and to continuously develop his/her skills.

Content

The course includes the following elements:

- Clinical training in ambulance care, 15 credits
- Teaching and supervision in ambulance care
- Supervision and teamwork when assessing emergency situations
- Patient safety in the context of ambulance care
- Care ethics in the context of ambulance care

Mandatory elements are specified in the course timetable.

The course will be implemented in part via a learning platform. The course contains exercises to train the development of skills, capabilities and approach.

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

To achieve a Pass with credit grade requires a Pass with credit for the written examination. Retake of the examination is offered.

Completion of the clinical training is limited to two clinical training periods.
