Prerequisites
60 hec specialisation, 1BP701 Art Education I, 30 hec and 1BP711 Art Education II, 30 hec, as well as 60 hec within the general field of education (AUO).

Expected learning outcomes

The course is intended to offer students developed skills concerning research- and development work used for pedagogical activities.

By the end of the course the student is expected to have:

- Ability to independently formulate, structure and conduct a research- and/or development oriented work
- Ability to write an argumentative report that presents research- and development work

Content

The course includes the following elements:

- Planning and execution of an independently written research- and/or development oriented work
- Written report of an independently produced project
- Critical study of another student's independently produced project

Type of Instruction

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The degree project is planned and conducted independently – individually or in pairs – together with the supervisor. The course includes an independent project, compulsory work seminars and individual studies of relevant academic literature.

The language of instruction is Swedish.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to pass the course the student needs to meet the expected learning outcomes. The course is assessed through a written degree project that is presented and defended at an examination seminar as well as an opposition on another student's degree project. The individual achievements of each student are assessed and graded. Further specification of the forms of assessment is presented in a study guide.

Course Evaluation

When the course has finished, an evaluation is compiled. The results are reported to the students and then archived according to the rules of the school.

Other

Additional expenses in connection to study assignments etc are paid for by the individual student.

A study certificate is available after successful completion of the course.
